

Chean Cheese Bound Cake

3 sticks of butter

8 oz. Cream cheese

3 cups Sugar

6 eggs


3 cups of flour

1 tsp. Vanilla

Preheat oven to 325. Cream butter and cream cheese together; add sugar until fluffy. Add egg and flour alternately ending with flour. Add vanilla. Pour into greased and floured Bundt pan or 10 tube pan. Bake for 1 hour and 25 minutes. Do not open oven door until the time is up to prevent falling. You may frost with cream cheese icing or sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Grand Prairie residents using the city's new "Snap and Send" app can now report issues, such as street light outages and code violations, using their smartphones. The app, currently compatible with iPhone, iPad and iPod touch, allows users to specify the location of an issue and attach a photo to send directly to city staff as well as track the status of their service requests.

Search "Snap and Send Grand Prairie TX" in the Apple App Store and download for free. The city plans to make the app available for Android users in the future.

Get ready to shake, rattle and roll as your toddler dances, marches and runs their way to literacy success! This interactive discovery time gives your child the opportunity to explore their world with new friends as they begin to move about.



Planting:

- Plant pre-chilled tulip and hyacinth bulbs (late December/early January). Plant daffodil and grape hyacinth.
- Plant pansies, flowering kale and cabbage, dianthus, cyclamen, violas and other cool season annuals.
- Continue to plant shade trees, fruit trees, and evergreen shrubs.

Pruning:

- Prune evergreen trees such as magnolias, live oaks, and wax myrtles if needed.
- Re-shape evergreen shrubs if needed.

Plant Care:

- Mulch leaves from the lawn. Shred excess leaves and add to planting beds or compost pile.
- Water lawn and all other plants once every three weeks or so, if supplemental rainfall is less than one inch in a three-week period.
- Fertilize cool-season color plants early in the month. Apply root-stimulator fertilizer to all newly transplanted trees and shrubs.
- Protect pansies, tender shrubs and other plants from hard freezes by covering with lightweight landscape fabric weighed down with bricks or rocks.

It's the holiday season, so there is a higher spike of package thefts, but can happen anytime of the year... a package is delivered to your home, and someone sees the delivery truck drop off a package to your front porch, near or at your front door- the delivery driver drives off a porch pirate steals the package right off your front porch.

To detour or catch a porch pirate, increase your security by installing cameras on or around your home. There are many new technologies out there to video activity, such as a doorbell at your front door. Most of these types of devices are easy to purchase at a local store and very easy to install and easy to watch the activity from your phone.

New smart locks are available now, so the delivery driver can set the package inside your door with either an access code or your unlocking then locking from an app on your phone.

Also think about having packages delivered to your work, an Amazon locker box, a post office box, or in-store pickup.

Help a neighbor watch out for their packages. If you see something, say something.

Let's keep our community from being victims of this rising crime.

DECEMBER 2018 LANDSCAPE TIPS



Here are some great things to do in our landscapes in the month of December. Here's just a few of those tips:

- Put your FREEZE PLAN in effect
- Mulch beds for protection during winter months
- Continue to check your irrigation system monthly, and make sure you have a rain/ freeze stat to shut it down when temperatures drop
- After the second freeze, if it happens this month, begin to cut back your perennials. You can mulch over them for some extra protection.
- And don't forget garden gifts for your favorite gardener during the holiday season.



Plant of the Month: Cyclamen

A common winter flower used in the landscape is the Cyclamen. It is not very winter hardy so you must consider covering in sub-freezing temperatures. It can do quite well throughout the winter except for those low temp nights. You can cover lightly with freeze cloth. It is best planted in somewhat protected areas near homes or buildings but is very colorful (reds, pinks, white, fuchsia) in shade or sun.



Ever wonder about **Poinsettias?**

How about a few fun facts...and myths about these beautiful Holiday plants.

- Joel Roberts Poinsett introduced the poinsettia plant to the U.S. from Mexico.
- In Mexico the poinsettia is a perennial shrub that will grow 10-15' tall.
- There are more than 100 varieties of poinsettias available today. Most noted varieties are red, white, pink and speckled.
- The showy colored parts of poinsettias are not the flowers of the plant, but instead are actually colored bracts (modified leaves).
- Poinsettias are not poisonous has some would like to believe. A study at Ohio State University showed that a 50 lb. child would have to consume more than 500 leaves to have any harmful effect... besides the taste is probably awful.
- Best to keep pets away from snacking on poinsettias as it can cause gastric distress...and all that is implied with that!
- The plant does ooze a milky sap which may cause skin reactions/ rashes, especially those with latex allergies.
- December 12th is Poinsettia Day, which marks the death of Joel Roberts Poinsett in 1851.

GOVERNANCE/DOCUMENTS

Know the Rules

Have you checked out the HOA's Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (DCC&Rs) lately? If not, now's a great time to brush up on the do's and don'ts of the community.

For those of you who were unaware, DCC&Rs play a crucial role in keeping the association running smoothly. DCC&Rs are legally binding rules and regulations that each homeowner agrees to when he or she purchases a unit within the association. If owners rent out their homes, it's the owner's responsibility to inform the new residents of the bylaws as well. DCC&Rs include stipulations on assessments, building design and additions, and the governance of the association. All residents need to understand these DCC&Rs so they don't unintentionally violate them; owners can be fined by the association and—in extreme cases—sued for violating the DCC&Rs. Owners are empowered when they understand the DCC&Rs and the procedures for changing or amending them when they are no longer applicable or relevant to the community.

While they may seem arbitrary, the DCC&Rs are legally enforceable. They also help ensure the association as a whole can thrive and that members are treated fairly and equally. So, don't be left in the dark—check out

the association's DCC&Rs today!

ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN GUIDELINE **BULLETIN #1: STORAGE BUILDINGS**

Section 4.23 states: ... "Any storage building shall be built of substantially the same material and design of the house situated on the Lots and must be approved by the ACC. ..." The following criteria will be used by the ACC in consideration of any such storage buildings to be placed on Lots:

- No building will exceed 80 square feet (e.g. 8 x 10)
- The building must be placed on concrete slab foundation
- No building will exceed 8 feet in height at the ridge line of the roof
- Roof pitch will be similar to that of the house
- Must be constructed of brick matching the house and/or cement fiber board (hardiplank)
- All paintable surfaces must be painted to match the trim color of the house or other colors as approved by the ACC
- Shingles must match that of the house
- Screening may be required based on visibility
- Placement of storage buildings are subject to ACC approval
- PLANS FOR ALL STORAGE BUILDINGS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO, AND APPROVED BY THE ACC PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION

The approval or lack of approval by the ACC shall not represent authority for any required local or municipal permits that may also be required.



DIY CHRISTMAS COUNTDOWN CALENDAR

SHOE ORGANIZER CALENDAR

Supplies:

- 1. Over the door pocket shoe organizer
- 2. 24 Plain or colored Note Cards
- 3. Clothes Pins

This easy countdown calendar can be created fairly simply and can be displayed on a closet or hallway door. Hang the shoe organizer over a door, write the numbers 1 to 24 on the note cards and use the clothes pins to attach the note cards to each pocket. Place a Christmas candy or one wrapped toy in each pocket. Each day your child can remove the number and receive the surprise in the pocket.

MUFFIN TIN CALENDAR

- 1. Metal 24 muffin tin
- 2. Colorful Christmas paper cut into 24 circles slightly larger than the muffin cup opening

- 5. School Glue

Garbage and Recycling Collection Info



All garbage and recycling must be set out by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day but no earlier than 8 p.m. the night before your collection day. Notify Code Compliance if violating with snap.

Garbage Collection:

Use any color plastic bag for garbage except blue or red (blue bags are used for recyclables only and will not be collected if they contain trash).

Do not put garbage in trash cans or any container except plastic bags. Containers will be taken with garbage.
