

Do The Texas Two-Step With Fire Ants

Two-stepping with fire ants includes broadcasting a bait insecticide over your entire yard and then treating individual problem mounds with an approved mound drench.

Step One - Broadcast Treatment: On a warm day, in the late afternoon, apply a broadcast treatment of fire ant bait with a hand-held spreader. Apply when the grass is dry and no rain is expected for 48 hours. Use fresh bait, preferably from an unopened container. Baits are slow acting and only achieve about 80% to 90% control. That's why you need two steps.

Step Two - Individual Mound Treatments: Apply a granular fire ant pesticide product on and around the fire ant mound. Then gently pour 2 to 5 gallons of water over the mound without disturbing the mound. Closely follow the directions on the pesticide label. Liquid drenches generally eliminate mounds within a few hours.

Lawn & Garden Tips

March is a good time to start planning lawn and gardening projects. By April 1 in North Texas, we should be safe from late season freezes. If you haven't already started planting, now is the time to get inspired and make a plan.

- Put down pre-emergent herbicide in February to prevent last year's weed seeds from germinating.
- Remove all dead vegetation from gardens.
- Sow vegetable and flower seeds or plant bedding plants. Be prepared to protect them in case of a late freeze. You can use the planting containers inverted over the plant but be sure to remove as soon as temps are above freezing.
- Plant summer flowering bulbs, perennial flowers shrubs and trees.
- Fertilize existing trees with fertilizer spikes around the drip line of the tree.
- Once grass starts to green up, mow to remove some of the dead grass, and fertilize with a balanced lawn fertilizer.
 Aerate lawn if soil is compacted. If needed use Broadleaf weed killer on lawn, but avoid getting it on desirable plants and trees.
- Add compost to garden soil and work it into the soil.
- Lightly prune trees to raise the canopy height, and remove diseased and crossing branches before it gets too hot.
- It is a great time to audit your sprinkler system by checking your controller settings and looking for leaks before letting it run on auto pilot. One inch of water per week is ideal for lawn, plants and trees. April and May is also thunderstorm season. If mother nature doesn't provide enough rain, be sure to supplement with your sprinklers, so that plants develop a strong root system heading into summer.

Lawn maintenance and gardening chores are great exercise that costs much less than a gym membership, and it also increases your property value. Plan your work, work your plan and then sit back and enjoy the beauty!

GROWING HERBS IN NORTH TEXAS

When choosing herbs that will grow well in north Texas, remember this area is zone 8, warm to hot during summer months.

Most herbs prefer full sun, so choose a sunny spot for your garden.

Do not plant your herbs close to other bushes or shrubs that need herbicides or insecticides as these are not safe to use on or near herbs.

Your soil should match the herb's specific water needs, as herbs are sensitive to moisture conditions. Some preferring well drained soil while other prefer a moist soil.

If you plan to store your herbs, it is better to wait to harvest after the plant begins to flower. Wash leaves in cold water before drying or freezing the herbs.

HERBS FOR ZONE 8:

Lavender – plant in a light, well-drained soil in full sun. This herb can grow up to 24 inches high. The lavender leaf and flower are edible and are used in cooking or for herbal teas.

Rosemary – grows year round and prefers well-drained soil, likes to be watered regularly and can grow as three feet or more. Use fresh rosemary in many chicken dishes, bread recipes and add to olive oil for a dipping sauce for pita breads. Rosemary is beautiful topped as a garnish.

Sage – loves full sun, well-drained soil and can get as tall as two – three feet. Try a different type of sage such as Pineapple Sage which is good in desserts. It is recommended to cook or dry sage leaves before eating, as raw sage leaves have a harsh flavor. Add cooked sage to chicken, stews or even on pizza.

Basil – needs full sun, well-drained moist soil and will grow up to three feet tall. Be sure and harvest basil before it flowers as it will lose some of the flavor after flowering occurs. Basil is delicious when added to chicken or shrimp recipes, as well as salads and pasta.

Mint – has so many varieties such as spearmint, peppermint, apple mint, chocolate mint or banana mint. This herb tolerates full sun to partial shade and will grow up to 24 inches. Mint is great added to teas, drinks, melon salads and even to pesto.

Early spring is the best time to plant your herb garden so you can enjoy herb filled cooking and grilling this summer.

CITY CODE COMPLIANCE REMINDER:

Sec. 29-89.1. - Parking on sidewalks and rights-of-way; towing of vehicles in violation.

The storage or parking of any vehicle, operable or inoperable, or any portion of such vehicle on the public right-of-way between

the improved roadway and the property line is hereby declared a nuisance and prohibited. Vehicles should not be parked or stored to impede traffic on the sidewalk or to block a portion of the roadway. Vehicles parked or stored on the right-of-way in violation of this article for a period in excess of forty-eight



(48) hours will be towed to the city vehicle impound or another approved vehicle storage facility and charges will be assessed for such expenses.

Reminder: Vehicles are not allowed to stand or park unattended for a continuous period of 48 hours on a public street. It is illegal to block the city sidewalk with your vehicle. Sidewalks are considered public right-of-way, and city ordinance prohibits vehicles from stopping, standing or parking on a sidewalk. Resource: https://library.municode.com

ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN GUIDELINE BULLETIN #1: STORAGE BUILDINGS

Section 4.23 states: ... "Any storage building shall be built of substantially the same material and design of the house situated on the Lots and must be approved by the ACC. ..." The following criteria will be used by the ACC in consideration of any such storage buildings to be placed on Lots:

- No building will exceed 80 square feet (e.g. 8 x 10)
- The building must be placed on concrete slab foundation
- No building will exceed 8 feet in height at the ridge line of the roof
- Roof pitch will be similar to that of the house
- Must be constructed of brick matching the house and/or cement fiber board (hardiplank)
- All paintable surfaces must be painted to match the trim color of the house or other colors as approved by the ACC
- Shingles must match that of the house
- Screening may be required based on visibility
- Placement of storage buildings are subject to ACC approval
- PLANS FOR ALL STORAGE BUILDINGS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO, AND APPROVED BY THE ACC <u>PRIOR</u> TO COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION

The approval or lack of approval by the ACC shall not represent authority for any required local or municipal permits that may also be required.

- Colored Sugar


Supplies needed:


