# Do you need swim diapers?

If your child isn't potty trained and he/she wants to dip toes and more into a public body of water, you need swim diapers. Regular diapers won't work. The material that makes diapers so absorbent also turns them into a waterlogged anchor around your child's waist once they are submerged in water. Not only is their absorbing action rendered useless once they soak up water, but their weight makes them super saggy to the point of falling off. And they definitely can't hold anything inside once they're stretched out. It's pretty ugly.

Swim diapers are designed to withstand water and contain solids. They aren't meant to absorb. Yep, that means pee will pass through to the water. But swim diapers should keep number twos inside eliminating what public pools fear most: fecal contamination.

### What type of swim diaper is best?

Remember that swim diapers need to have a snug fit to contain poop, so they will probably be tighter than your everyday diapers.

Swim diapers come in disposable or reusable versions, each with their own advantages. Disposables are cheap and offer convenience, but they tend to sag and are more prone to letting something slip out.

Reusable swim diapers that have velcro or snaps at the side usually offer a better fit but are more expensive and high maintenance. After changing your child out of a reusable, you have to flush the diaper contents down the toilet, package the dirty reusable to take home, and then rinse it and run it through the wash. Also, since babies grow pretty quickly, they might grow into a larger reusable size before the summer is over. Consider how quickly your little one is growing before investing in a reusable swim diaper.

## How does this work at the pool?

If public pools allow diapered children to enter at all, their rules may differ. Many require kids to have two layers. A disposable diaper along with a reusable or a swim short on top can work, or some allow a reusable underneath with a swim short on top. Many parents find that disposable on bottom and reusable on top is the best defense against spillage anyway.



Using real seasonal flowers placed







# Lawn Care Plan



By leaving your clippings on the lawn after you mow and allowing them to work back into the soil, you can have a naturally beautiful lawn. Grass clippings also make excellent compost for gardens.

Doing less to your lawn can improve the health of your grass. Here are eight easy steps to an easy lawn improvement program:

- Mow Less Longer blades of grass allow the lawn to take in more sunlight and crowd out weeds.
- Stop Raking If you cut off just a third of the blade, you can leave the clippings as free fertilizer.
- Stop Dethatching Too Only dethatch on lawns that have been over fertilized. Thatch, a buildup of roots and leaves just above the soil, isn't a problem.

- Fertilize Less Generally, researchers say, most grasses do just fine with a total of three pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet in at least three carefully timed treatments over a season.
- Spray Less Herbicide Healthy grass should crowd out weeds.
- Spray Less Insecticide If you have bug problems, diagnose first. Call your extension agent if you need help identifying what bug is eating your grass.
- Water Less A typical lawn can soak up 10,000 gallons of water a summer, which can increase your water bill by 50 percent. One solution: Wean your lawn from water. Wait until a footprint doesn't spring back, then water as little as 1/4 inch a week just to keep the roots alive. If it's very dry, protect your lawn by cutting down on traffic.
- **Accept Imperfection** If the site gets fewer than four hours of sun or is otherwise unsuited for grass, try another ground cover.

# IT'S TERMITE SEASON

#### **Termite Prevention:**

One of the easiest ways for termites to enter your home is for them to enter in through the weep holes at the bottom of the bricks around the outside of your home. When the soil level rises above the slab termites can tunnel straight from the soil outside of your home right into the wooden framing between the walls. This is one of the most common ways termites get into homes. A simple way to prevent this from happening is to keep the soil level below the top of your slab. The slabs on most homes already rise up above the soil level at least two or three inches, the higher the better. This spring when you add mulch to your flowerbeds, it might be a good idea to remove the old mulch first to prevent the mulch or soil from building up over the edge of the slab. This will help keep termites at bay. Don't make it any easier for the termites to get into your home. Keep your soil level around the slab as low as possible.

The City of Grand Prairie offers curbside recycling for all Grand Prairie residents. These recycling bins are open bins (have no lid) therefore, they are subject to the natural elements such as wind and wildlife. # **HOA POOL RULES**

- 1. **NO LIFEGUARD** on duty! Swim at your own risk!
- 2. Children under the age of 14 MUST be accompanied by a resident, 18 years or older, possessing a valid pool card.
- 3. Only4 guests allowed per residence. A resident 18 years or older, possessing a valid pool card, MUST accompany all guests.
- 4. Proper swimwear required.
- 5. Persons with skin diseases, open sores or wounds, inflamed eyes, nasal or ear infections, or any communicable diseases are not allowed to use the pool.
- 6. For the health and safety of the residents, rubber pants in addition to swim diapers are REQUIRED for all non-toilet trained children.
- 7. NO water wings allowed without a U.S. Coast Guard approved life vest properly fitted with age and with adult supervision. NO rafts allowed
- 8. NO diving allowed.
- 9. NO pets. NO smoking, NO vaping. NO alcohol or glass objects of any kind allowed in pool area. NO food or drink allowed in the pool water.
- 10. Radios and other noise should be maintained at a low level at all times.
- 11. DO NOT ride bikes, tricycles, scooters, roller blades, skateboards or any other similar vehicles in the pool area.
- 12. Running, roughhousing or general horse play that may endanger the safety of others is NOT allowed.
- 13. Foul language and/or threatening behavior wit NOT be tolerated.
- 14. Emergency equipment is to be used for emergencies only.
- 15. Access to the equipment room Is restricted.
- 16. NO trespassing after pool hours or during pool closures.
- 17. The Homeowners Association or Management Company are not responsible for personal property, accidents, injuries or theft.
- **18. VANDALISM WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.** To report vandalism, call police immediately then notify Management Company 817-473-6787.
- 19. Pools WILL CLOSE during Inclement weather.
- 20. In case of EMERGENCY, CALL 911.

Violation of pool rules may lead to revoking of pool privileges and/or criminal prosecution.
