



Seeking Communications Committee Chairperson





Cleaning Oil Off a Driveway

If your car is leaking oil, use cardboard to catch the drips when you park and try to get it fixed ASAP. If you put cat litter in the spot where oil is dripping, it will absorb most (if not all) of the oil before it stains. When oil is spilled, a little water should be hosed onto it immediately. This will cause the oil to float to the top of the puddle to prevent it from soaking in.

If you have a set-in oil stain on your driveway or the street in front of your lot, absorb and dispose of as much of the oil as you can with a rag or paper. Then, try one of the following methods to clean the stain. Be careful not to let hazardous products wash away into storm drains.

- Kitty Litter (the cheap kind) rub on, let sit, sweep up, repeat
- Dark Cola pour on, scrub vigorously, repeat if necessary
- WD-40 Completely saturate the oil spot, let sit 1 minute, wipe with rag
- Simple Green spray on, soak several hours, and rinse area
- Liquid Tide Cover area with liquid laundry soap, add ¼ cup of water on top of soap, use old broom to scrub area for about 5 minutes, wipe or rinse with a hose, repeat if necessary
- Oil Removal Product from Hardware Store pour on, rub in or scrub until the job is complete (some products will absorb and turn to powder to sweep away)

Mow at a higher setting by adjusting the height setting on your mower up one or two notches. Taller grass will create shade which will reduce evaporation of water from the soil and protect the roots from excessive heat.

Plant growth naturally slows down and/or plants go dormant during a lengthy drought. Do not encourage new growth by fertilizing during drought or extreme summer temperatures.

The Peninsula PID Board approved a beautification plan to add trees in the median on Grand Peninsula Drive. The plan was originally established years ago and has been on hold. What Are CC&Rs Anyway?

When our community was established, the Developer filed a series of documents with the state designed to uphold the integrity of our community and spell out the duties of our association, and the responsibilities of each owner. Those documents are often referred to as the governing documents and are made up of the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws, and the Conditions, Covenants & Restrictions or CC&R's.

The Articles of Incorporation is a one-page document that must be filed with the Secretary of State. It simply states that a non-profit corporation (our community association) is being formed. The Bylaws dictate the powers and duties of the Board of Directors (when meetings occur, how the Board is elected, etc.) The CC&R's dictate the powers and duties of the corporation and regulate both the physical characteristics of our development and the lifestyles of our residents. Of all of the governing documents, the CC&R's are often the least understood but inarguably the most important.

To close escrow on your home, you signed a series of papers, one of which stated that you read the CC&R's and agreed to abide by them. When escrow closed, you entered in to a contractual agreement with the other owners in our community to be members of the association and conform to the dictates of those CC&R's.

The CC&R's provide a structural framework to help residents of different backgrounds, ideals, and perceptions to live together in harmony and by doing so, the community and our property values benefit. If we had no architectural controls (as spelled out in the CC&R's) or no ability to correct violations of the Rules & Regu-

lations (also spelled out in the CC&R's), then there would be no harmony and ultimately our community and our property values would suffer. In other words, the CC&R's are good business. They help ensure that our property values are maintained and our investments protected.

Example: What would the impact on your property values be if your neighbor decided to repair automobiles in his parking area as a part-time job and decided to advertise with a big sign he nailed to his roof? Furthermore, in order to attract attention to the sign, he painted his garage door bright red. This example may be a little over the top, but it applies equally to the neighbor who doesn't maintain his/her living area. The bottom line is that your property values would suffer. No one would want to buy your home and have to live next to such "chaos". Since market values are affected by the law of supply and demand, if the demand (or attractiveness) of your community is poor, then the supply (or cost) is reduced. When the demand is high (the community is aesthetically attractive) then the supply (or property values) are increased. The CC&R's promote conformity, which encourages harmony, which has a positive impact on the value of our community.

The next time you get a note from the management company explaining why you are in noncompliance with the CC&R's or the Rules & Regulations, take a moment to remember what the spirit of the CC&R's embrace (protection of your investment) and be thankful that our Board of Directors are taking their job seriously and are working to protect, preserve and enhance our property values.

East Broad, Grand Meadow Construction

It has been one year since the 3.2 million dollar
East Broad Street widening began. The project
has reconstructed Broad Street between North
Holland and Day Miar to a four-lane divided
roadway with curbs and a wide sidewalk on
the north side.

In April and May work was under way on median openings and left turn lanes. In June, traffic signals will be installed at the intersection and street lights will be installed along the median by Oncor. According to David Boski, P.E., Transportation Engineer for the City of Mansfield, "We can soon expect one lane of traffic each way while median work is completed and both lanes open by July."

Beautification will include grass on the median. The City of Mansfield Landscape Administrator will make a complete beautification plan at a later time.

A future alternate route is also under construction. Grand Meadow Boulevard, running parallel to Broad Street, will become a four-lane



undivided collector from Holland Road at the Sports Complex entry east to Day Miar Road along the south side of Mary Lillard Intermediate School. Construction began in early December; utilities are completed and subgrade is being prepared for paving. The City of Mansfield website says completion should be by end of 2014. According to Mr. Boski this could be as early as July or August.
