




HOUSEHOLD TIPS:

Before throwing the old toothbrush out, take a look at what it can do to improve the small things inside your home. If you have concerns about using the toothbrush for culinary or cosmetic purposes, boil it with water in a pot for 3 to 4 minutes.



Use with an abrasive cleaner to scrub around drains and faucets, grates, vents, grills, and between bathroom tiles.

- · Cleaning jewelry and silverware
- Cleaning between the teeth of a chainsaw
- Applying pipe sealant in hard to reach places
- "Brushing the corn's teeth." Brushing away bits of silk that cling to the ears of fresh corn after husking.
- · Cleaning fish
- Cleaning off mud and other debris from the soles of shoes
- · De-greasing bicycle parts



- Scrubbing small stains off of carpets or upholstery
- Applying glue to grooves and joints
- Personal grooming such as, brushing brows and lashes, teasing and curling small sections of hair, fixing mustaches, sideburns, and beards.

Tips:

- To clean a vent that is removable, soak it in a strongly alkaline cleaner and solvent, then scrub using a stiff toothbrush to get into cracks and crevices. If it is not removable, dip the brush in a strong alkaline cleaner and scrub.
- To clean gold jewelry, fill a small container with dishwashing liquid and 1 teaspoon of ammonia. Soak the jewelry in this strong solution for a few minutes, then clean with an old toothbrush. Rinse and pat dry.
- To clean the filter on your washing machine, first use an old toothbrush to remove any lint. Soak the filter in vinegar overnight, then rinse it with water.



Summer Landscaping Tips

Flowers: Remove old flower stalks and dead foliage from perennials.

Sow seeds of calendulas, dianthus, pansies, snapdragons and other winter flowers in flats for planting outside in mid-to-late fall.

Plant bluebonnet seeds. This winter annual must germinate in late summer or early fall, develop a good root system and be ready to grow in spring when the weather warms. Plant the seeds in well-prepared soil, ½ inch deep and water thoroughly.

Plant fall-flowering bulbs such as bella donna, fall crocus, oxblood and spider lilies.

Still time to plant fall annual flowers from transplants; such as celosias, marigolds and zinnias. Choose healthy plants in bud but not in bloom.

Plant fall-flowering perennials such as fall asters, Mexican bush sage, mums and others. Buy plants in at least 1-gallon sizes.

Container grown plants can still be planted into the landscape.

Consider buying Crape myrtles in bloom so you can choose the exact color you want. They can still be planted now (from containers) do not let them dry out.

If heat-tolerant annuals such as impatiens, petunias, verbenas and others have become leggy, prune them back to encourage full, vigorous new growth. This will also work for annuals in containers.

Lawn: St. Augustine grass, Bermuda grass and other warm-season grasses should be planted

early in the month. Do not let them dry out.

Trees & Shrubs: Remove as much as 1/3 of the growth of bush roses, pruning just above buds that face away from the centers of the plants. This will prepare the plants for fall growth and a great flush of blooms.

Remove dead or damaged tree limbs. Follow the multiple cut method for pruning.

Fertilizing:

Remember to fertilize plants:

Flowering annuals with 3-1-2 or 4-1-2 ratio plant food for new growth for fall.

Turf with the same ratio (if gray leaf spot in St. Augustine grass is a problem, wait until September).

Pet waste is a health hazard and water pollutant. To help responsible pet-owners in our community, pet waste disposal cans have been installed in high traffic walking areas for your convenience.

It's easy to protect our drinking water and keep our green spaces beautiful and safe for all residents, by knowing a few things:

- Pick up your pet waste. It is not fertilizer.
- Carry disposable bags while you are walking your dog to pick up and dispose of waste in (our new receptacles or) the trash.
- Flush your pet's waste down the toilet to be treated.
- Bury pet waste in the yard, at least 6 inches deep and cover with soil. It will decompose slowly. Bury the waste in several different locations in the yard and keep it away from vegetable gardens.

Mira Lagos Monthly Real Estate Market Update

- The median sales price decreased by 1.4% to \$269,000
- The average list price increased 20.1% to \$291,841
