

Fall is finally here and it's time to pull out the boots and sweaters. While Texans are fortunate to have milder winters, it's still important to remember your landscaping! Follow these simple tips to maintain a beautiful lawn and garden, even in the colder months ahead.

- As mums bloom and fade, keep spent blooms cut off to encourage more flowers.
- Water and fertilize cool season annuals
- You can plant mums you bought in pots in the ground and they will give you years of flowers each fall.
- Don't let plants dry out before a freeze; they will be damaged easier when dry.
- Plant pansies all through November and December.
- Plant daffodils and other spring flowering bulbs. (crocus, Dutch iris, freesia, etc)
- Groom the garden by raking away leaves and pulling up dying annuals.
- Use your own parsley, rosemary, and sage in your dressing.
- Bring hyacinths and paper white narcissus bulbs indoors for holiday bloom.
- Finish cutting back perennials; mulch perennial garden after ground has frozen

Stop That Barking!

Dogs left alone all day get bored and restless, and many find relief in barking. Some respond noisily to any and all activity. But, nothing is as annoying as incessant barking—even for dog lovers. If your dog is a yapper or a yowler, please consider some of these bark-abatement ideas to keep the noise down in your area. Your neighbors will thank you!

Training. Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the Yellow Pages. Training not only helps your dog, you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why your dog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate.

Citronella collars. A humane alternative to the electric-shock, anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.

Confinement. Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.

Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.

Companionship. Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a mid-day visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.

PARKING 101

We are always getting reports of on street parking from your neighbors. Parking in your driveway and garage is not only less disruptive to your neighbors, but it creates a safe neighborhood and helps prevent car thefts. Here are some parking tips to live by:

- Use your driveway and garage! Make sure that in your spring cleaning, you take the time to clean out and make room for your car in you the garage.
- When parking in your driveway, be careful not to block the sidewalk. This is a violation of the City Ordinances.

If you must have vehicles parked on the street:

- Do not block mailboxes. Vehicles parked in front or close to mailboxes will not have their mail delivered by the US Postal Service.
- Be sure to park in a way that you are not blocking sight or traffic.
- Park in front of your home and have your guests do the same.
 Please do not punish your neighbors by blocking their home and spaces for visitor parking.
- Be sure the vehicle you are parking on the street is a regular day to day use vehicle. It must move on a daily basis like going to and from work or school.

Please be a courteous neighbor. If you can, park in the garage or driveway.



If you're considering running for the board, we ask that you take a few moments to ask yourself the following three questions:

Do I have the time?: As a board member, you will need to devote at least several hours of your time each month to association business.

In addition to regular monthly board meetings, you will need to be active in email discussions and occasional special meetings. During special projects, you may need to spend a little extra time on association business. Some board members may also spend a little more time than others if they work with a committee

Can I make tough decisions when it's required?: The primary role of the board is to conduct the business of the association. This doesn't just mean approving the budget, but also developing and enforcing policies. Board members are required to step outside their immediate circle of family and neighbors and make decisions based on the greater good of the community.

Can I do all this and have fun, too?: It isn't all about policies and tough decisions. Our community is only as good as we make it, and establishing and maintaining a sense of community is a part of a board member's responsibility. Planning and attending functions such as our picnics and being a presence in the community are as important as any policy decisions you may make.


Grand Prairie Snap & Send!



Grand Prairie residents using the city's new "Snap and Send" app can now report issues, such as street light outages and code violations, using their smartphones. The app, currently compatible with iPhone, iPad and iPod touch, allows users to specify the location of an issue and attach a photo to send directly to city staff as well as track the status of their service requests.

Search "Snap and Send Grand Prairie TX" in the Apple App Store and download for free. The city plans to make the app available for Android users in the future.

- 2 Honeycrisp apples (or other crisp apples)
- 2 tbsp butter
- 3 tbsp brown sugar, packed
- 1 tbsp flour
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 4 caramels
- Optional toppings: vanilla ice cream, caramel sauce and cinnamon

Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. 2. To get the blooming apple look, you need to cut the apples. Slice off the top 1/4 to 1/2 of the apples. Scoop out the core. I don't have an apple corer so I used my metal ½ teaspoon measuring spoon. Then, use a thin knife to make two, deep circular cuts around the center of the apple. Next, turn the apple over and make narrow cuts all the way around the apple. Flip it back over and you can see all of the cuts.

- 3. Place the apples in an oven safe dish and put two caramels into the center of each apple.
- 4. Heat butter and brown sugar in the microwave for 30 second, stir and continue heating for an additional 30 seconds. Remove from the microwave and stir in flour and cinnamon. Divide the mixture over the top of the two sliced apples.
- 5. Bake at 375 for 25-30 minutes. (Check apples after 25 minutes and continue cooking until tender. Some apples can take 45 min to 1 hour to soften.)
- 6. Remove from the oven and use a large spoon to move the apples into bowls.
- 7. Top with a scoop of ice cream, drizzle with caramel and sprinkle with cinnamon. The ice cream will cause the caramel in the center to harden so eat quickly or put the ice cream scoop on the side.
