

Being Neighborly Helps your Heart



Getting to know your neighbors has more benefits than borrowing an egg or their snow blower. The more you know your neighbors, the less the chance of having a heart attack, says a new study.

Psychologists at the University of Michigan found that people who made good social connections within their neighborhood had a 22 percent reduced chance of having a heart attack, according to a fouryear study tracking almost 5,300 Americans over the age of 50 who had no history of heart disease.

Being neighborly, the study says, helps residents feel secure and more willing to help each other. But being friendly with your neighbors only goes so far. Researchers found little difference between residents who had a moderately high level of engagement with their neighbors and those who were extremely engaged.

The study's findings were recently published in the Journal of Epidemiology and Community Health.

National Aviation Day has been celebrated every year on August 19th since its enactment in 1939. The date was chosen to coincide

ment in 1939. The date was chosen to coincide with the birthday of aviation pioneer Orville Wright. Not only does this holiday represent the work done by Wright and his brother Wilbur, but it's an all-encompassing holiday for every aspect of aviation. Americans take the time to celebrate the achievements made possible through the history of aircraft and passenger flights.

Aviation History

On December 17, 1903, the Wright Brothers made aviation history. Not only did they successfully fly an aircraft, but this was the first time that controllers were used to help navigate the plane. The airplane was in flight for a total of 12 seconds. While the plane traveled only 120 feet, this is the first flight completed with the revolutionary controllers.


These advances in aircraft technology quickly paved the way for other pioneers of the era looking to take to the skies, such as Amelia Earhart and Charles Lindbergh. Controlled aircraft made commercial flights between set destinations possible, and the advances also forever changed the way the military operates.

Holiday Enactment

The idea for National Aviation Day was officially ordered by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt in 1939. He chose August 19th because it was the same day as Orville Wright's birthday. The aviation pioneer lived to see the date, as well as nine years beyond that. Roosevelt died in office April 1945.

At first, the date for National Aviation Day was controversial among some groups because the Wright brothers weren't technically the first ones to experiment with airplanes. However, the brothers are credited with being the first to invent fixed flight wings that led to the creation of commercial and military aircraft. Despite the controversy, there's no doubt that aviation wouldn't be the same without the contributions of Orville and Wilbur Wright. The lives of the two brothers are celebrated on a different holiday on December 17th called Wright Brothers Day.

Lyndon Baines Johnson Day in United States

Lyndon Baines Johnson Day is an annual state holiday in Texas in the United States on August 27. It celebrates the birthday of Lyndon Baines Johnson, popularly known as "LBJ", who was the 36th president of the United States.

What do people do?

A range of special programs, events, and parties are held Lyndon Baines Johnson Day across Texas and other parts of the United States, such as Washington DC. On this day, many people remember famous speeches, including one about a "Great Society", and the changes that took place across the nation during Johnson's presidency.

Public life

Lyndon Baines Johnson Day is a partial staffing holiday in Texas so state government employees are entitled take a day off but state offices remain open with the required staff numbers. State offices are not closed on another day when designated holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday. Many public transport schedules do not change on Lyndon Baines Johnson Day in places such as Austin, Dallas, and Houston in Texas. However, those unsure of their schedules may need to contact the public transit centers.

Mira Lagos "Fill a Backpack" Community Sharing Event

August 1-22, 2015, the ML HOA Social Committee together with our Mira Lagos family will sponsor the "Fill a Backpack" Community-Wide Sharing Event to provide assistance to children (and families) within our local commuting area.

Did you know that there are families that live within and just outside our community who struggle to provide a basic meal for their children or feel overwhelmed by the "supply list" which quickly add up to \$100 for every child who attends school in the Mansfield Independent School District? I was surprised to learn that some schools recorded more than 50% of their students on free or reduced lunch in MISD and may or may not have dinner or breakfast the next morning. Mira Lagos can be a shining light in a sometimes dark situation for children living in our community and surrounding area.

Our goal for the 1st "Fill-A-Backpack" Community Sharing Event is to fill about 50 (or more) backpacks with generous donations from the Mira Lagos Community.

To participate:

- Purchase a new backpack. No used backpacks please!
- Fill it with standard school supplies and/or non-perishable food items.
- Identify the grade-level (K, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th/Intermediate/Middle/High School) on the outside of the backpack for ease in distribution.
- Supplies may include, but not limited to: paper, notebooks, folders, pencils, pens, erasers, scissors, glue, calculators, pencil cases, binders, etc.
- Non-Perishable Food Items may include, but not limited to: any can good, spaghetti or other pasta, boxed items like hot and cold cereal, peanut butter, jelly, snack bars, fruit rolls, etc.

Large Brush Pickup Program

The City of Grand Prairie Large Brush Pickup Program is operated year round on a rotation basis from north to south week by week and provides curbside pickup of brush that is not practical or eligible for collection by the city's weekly garbage collection. (For your tree limbs and brush to be picked up with your regular weekly garbage, just bundle into 6-foot lengths no larger than 1 cubic yard and no heavier than 50 lbs, and place it next to your household garbage. Bagged leaves and shrubs will be collected with household garbage but not grass clippings.) Brush must originate from the residential property pickup location only. The program operates by geographic zones within a designated week of each month.



Large Brush Pickup Fees

- Residents receive one free brush pickup each month up to 5 cubic yards.
- Residents are charged \$85 for each additional 5 cubic yards after the once-a-month free pickup. Residents are charged \$85 for any special request pickup that is not scheduled during the assigned week.
- Residents can be fined if they place brush at the curbside for an extended amount of time.

*If a resident has an oversized pile, a notice will be placed on their front door, which requires the resident's signature authorizing the City to add the extra charge to the resident's water bill. Residents who do not respond to the notice within 24 hours, must remove the pile from the curb within three days or be subject to City Code violations. www.gptx.org

The Grand Connection



The Grand Connection transit system serves those who are at least 60 years of age or have a physical or mental disability.

If you are 60 years or older, you must provide proof of age (a copy of your state issued driver's license, a stated issued identification card or a birth certificate will meet this requirement).

An individual with a physical or mental disability, must have a physician or your licensed health care professional complete and verify Part V of the application. If you are a Medicaid applicant, please mark it on the application.

We will verify your Medicaid status with the Texas Department of Health and Human Services Transportation Department.

There are no fare charges for medical/dental appointments to the Dallas County Health and Human Services Nutrition Program. However, there are fare charges for other requests, as follows:

Grocery Store, School and Work: \$1.00 each way

Passengers may travel with one (1) companion, if space is available. The companion must travel to the same location as the passenger and will not be permitted to depart the vehicle at a difference location. Companions must be 16 years of age or older, unless an exception is approved by the Transit Coordinator or by the Transportation Services Director in writing (emergency cases only may be approved by verbal approval).

If a passenger requires assistance while traveling, they may have a Personal Care Attendant (PCA) travel with them. The PCA must be 16 years of age or older, unless an exception is



approved by the Transit Coordinator or by the Transportation Services Director, in writing (emergency cases only may be approved by verbal approval).

Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 4:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Tuesday and Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Saturday: no service Sunday: no service

Avoiding stressful activities today is the rule. For example, if golf is your favorite hobby, yet it can cause you stress, then make plans to play golf another day.


Spending the day in a hammock is a far more appropriate activity.

- ¼ cup milk
- 4 eggs
- ½ cup light sour cream (Daisy brand preferred)
- 2 garlic cloves, pressed
- ¼ teaspoon kosher salt
- ¾ teaspoon Don Enrique Mild Hatch Chili Powder
- 6-7 ounces cheese, finely diced (I used leftover fresh mozzarella, cheddar and an unmarked something or other from the cheese drawer)
- 1 shallot, finely minced
- 3 ounces roasted Hatch chiles, chopped

Instructions

- Heat oven to 375F degrees. Unroll pie crust and place in a 10-inch pie plate; crimp edge and place in refrigerator.
- Microwave kale for 2 minutes. Drain and set aside.
- In a 2-cup measuring cup, pour half and half and milk. Add eggs, sour cream, garlic, salt and chili powder. Whisk well to combine.
- Remove pie shell from refrigerator and layer cheese, shallot, kale and chiles, ending with a layer of cheese. Pour egg-milk mixture over tart and bake for 45 minutes.
- Remove and cool for 20-45 minutes before serving. Tart is good slightly warm or at room temperature, so don't think you have to serve it steaming hot.
- Cut into 6-10 pieces, depending on appetites and what else is on the menu.
